This weekend marks the end of the first part of the advent season, counting from the first Sunday of advent to 16th December, ushering us into the second part with the celebration of Gaudete Sunday

(Rejoice Sunday). During this weekend, we light the rose-coloured candle at mass to lighten the mood as we cross the mid-point

between the start of the season and the joy that comes with the anticipation of the celebration of Christmas.

Advent is a season with rhythm. This can be seen in the organisation of the liturgy and the symbolic rituals. Central to this rhythm is the Word.

In the first weekend, St. Matthew in the text of the Gospel, presented the image of the rapture with the example of the flood at Noah's time, the men in the fields and the women on the millstone, urging all to stay awake. This fire-alarm approach is meant to create spiritual anxiety. To calm the anxiety, the second weekend offered a voice; a voice crying in the wilderness: *prepare the way of the Lord...*

In this third weekend, John from the prison, sent his disciples to confirm if, Jesus is truly the awaited messiah. Jesus responded with a list of testimonies: the blind sees, the lame walks, lepers are cleansed, the dumb speaks, the dead rises, and the poor hears the good news. As we journey through this advent season, may we encounter with joy the Word made flesh, who liberates.
