Dear Parents,

As a staff, we are committed to nurturing all those in our care so that we all may grow in a deeper awareness of God's presence and a greater understanding of God's teaching bringing to life the vision of our School Motto: *That All May Be One*. I feel very privileged to lead such a beautiful school and I very much look forward to the year ahead.



We have begun to feel the momentum – we are embarking on a new year

with new targets and will continue to raise the bar to ensure our students receive the best possible learning opportunities at St Bernard's. Our goal is to continue to be a leading school for best practice, student growth and improvement. To do this effectively, we must begin with building relationships with the students and fostering a partnership with families. We must work collaboratively to challenge and build the capacity of all in our community.

Our School Wide Targets for 2020

Each year we develop an Annual Improvement Plan with 3 goals and 3 targets for school improvement based on data. We use assessment data, satisfaction surveys, improvement surveys and feedback to determine our targets each year. This year our targets are as follows:

- To increase student growth in NAPLAN by 20% in English and Mathematics.
- To improve student agency and voice in Religious Education from 2.0 to 2.2; using the Student Satisfaction Survey.
- To continue to improve student learning, pro-social skills and wellbeing through the School Wide Positive Behaviour program and Berry Street strategies.

To reach these targets, we have implemented the following initiatives for 2020:

Religious Education

Bernadette Scott and Lee Herden from the Religious Education Team at Catholic Education, are working with staff to develop an understanding and process for developing conceptual understandings, identifying concepts and understanding goals. This will filter through to other areas of the curriculum.

Explicit, Direct Literacy Instruction K-2 – Teaching and Learning Pilot

This year K-2 teachers will be involved in an Explicit Teaching Project. This teaching and learning pilot will support Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 teachers from 3 NSW schools in the Archdiocese to increase their capacity to teach students using instructional strategies that are systematic, direct and explicit. It is a spaced program that will be implemented over four terms and it will be delivered by Associate Professor Lorraine Hammond. This pilot project will be supported by Catholic Education. Through a range of opportunities teachers will be supported to improve their knowledge of the learning brain and how it links to implementing instructional strategies to support literacy teaching and learning in Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two classrooms. All professional learning delivered as part of the project will link to the NSW Syllabus for the Australian Curriculum - English.

Maths Pathway

As part of our K-12 Pathway, St Bernard's Year 6 students will be engaging with the **Maths Pathway** resources to support their mathematical learning. This is in line with Carroll College and the introduction of this resource to Year 7 2020. This will support the smooth transition from St Bernard's to Carroll College at the end of the year. This opportunity will also allow for staff across the K-12 Pathway to work together and share in professional learning that benefits all our students.

We are looking forward to working in partnership with you to foster a love of learning with your child.

PLUCK IT OUT

Mt. 5 vs 29

This weekend, our gospel reading is the continuation of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount contained in Matthew's gospel chapter five. In the narrative, Jesus offered a new understanding of the Mosaic law, calling his audience to cultivate a better appreciation of the law compared to the teachers of the law, challenging them to a more authentic piety than that of the Pharisees, and a more positive attitude towards God, the world and neighbour.

In the passage he further challenged the disciple in strong terms to 'pluck out' anything that might cause them to act in a manner that is incongruous with God's law and disrespectful of our neighbour. While scripture scholars warned against the literal interpretation of this expression, Jesus is insistent on the need for his listeners to eschew themselves from the possible occasions and events that might lead them to a reprehensible act and end.

At a time when road fatalities are blamed on human error induced by alcohol and phone usage; when domestic violence is blamed on drugs and addiction; with some families losing their entire wealth to poker machines and gambling; with some of our young people performing poorly in academics while spending hours on screens, the admonition of Jesus to '*pluck it out*' in Matthean gospel remains absolutely valid.

As governments around the world are being challenged to put ethical, social and environmental issues at the forefront, instead of being driven purely by profit and self-interest, we look to the gospel, fully trusting the words of Jesus as he calls us to live by the law of love. Led by his Spirit, we can open our hearts to the needs of the world.

Staff Professional Development

We welcomed Bernadette Scott and Lee Herden: Religious Education & Faith Formation Officers **from** Catholic Education to school this week. Bernadette led our staff meeting on Tuesday afternoon. Her provoking question for our learning was, **"What is a Concept?".**

Educators have traditionally taught through topics and content – lots of factual information which students would regurgitate as a way of learning. We are currently being challenged to move away from this form of programming and teaching to move to a Conceptual framework. This change of programming and teaching will enable our students to organise their thinking and achieve a stronger understanding that has meaning and purpose.

It has been wonderful opportunity for teachers to workshop with our experts and their grade partners during the week. Bernadette will return in Week 11 to support us on our educational journey.

What is Respect?

The word **respect** comes from the Latin word "respectus" meaning attention, regard or consideration. **Respect is** a **concept.**

- Respect is thinking and acting in a positive way about yourself or others
- Respect is thinking and acting in a way that shows others you care about their feelings and their well-being
